## ROGER J. PORTER, M.D.

1. Penry JK, Porter RJ, Corcoran WR, Press HM: Video Techniques for Research in Clinical Epilepsy. Shown at World Congress of Neurological Sciences, New York, September 20-27, 1969. This 30-minute videotape was shown through the closed-circuit television network of the U.S. Congress on two occasions. The development of multicamera recording techniques that were standardized for the Collaborative Study of Epilepsy, and the seizure types according to the International classification of Epileptic Seizures are described. the application of video techniques in behavioral and EEG correlation, including EEG telemetry, pursuit rotor performance, and psychometric testing are demonstrated.
2. Penry JK, Porter RJ: Exhibit of Epilepsy Abstracts Retrieval System (EARS). Shown at American Epilepsy Society, New York, December 3, 1970; American Academy of Neurology, New York, April 23-24, 1971; American Neurological Association, Washington, D.C., June 14-15, 1971. The Epilepsy Abstracts Retrieval System allows the user to retrieve abstracts without the use of extensive codes.
3. Penry JK, Porter RJ, Wolf AA Jr, Press HM: The Absence Seizure. Shown at the 23rd Western Institute of Epilepsy, San Diego, March 16-18, 1972. This is a 26-minute black-and-white film with sound tract taken from a videotape monitor. Absence seizure types are illustrated from multicamera video recordings of the patient and the EEG. The results of a two-observer analysis of 374 absence seizure video recorded longitudinally in 48 patients are summarized and findings of diagnostic inference are emphasized. Translated into Japanese and distributed in Japan, 1976.
4. Dreifuss FE, Goode DJ, Penry JK, Porter RJ: Different Diagnosis of Complex Partial Seizures. This 30-minute 16mm color film shows seizures recorded at the Clinical Center, NIH and differentiates the diagnosis of absence seizures, hysteria, transient ischemia, schizophrenia, and other disorders from complex partial seizures. Received the Walnut Leaf (Gold) Award for outstanding contribution for continuing medical education in neurology, at the John Muir Memorial Hospital Medical Film Festival, Walnut Creek, California, May 1976.
5. Cereghino JJ, Escueta AV, Goldensohn E, MacNamara J, Porter RJ: How to Recognize and Classify Seizures. This 20-minute, 16mm teaching film, produced by the Epilepsy Foundation of America, explains the differentiation of epileptic seizures. The film won the Fourth Annual Film Award of the American Occupational Therapy Association, 1981.
6. (Contributor) The Comprehensive Clinical Management of the Epilepsies is a 20-minute film illustrating the multidisciplinary approach to the treatment of epilepsy. The film is divided into 1) diagnosis, 2) therapy, and 3) monitoring. Each of these processes is associated with research advances of medical, psychosocial, educational, rehabilitative and prognostic importance. Developed by the Epilepsy Foundation of America, 1984.
7. (Contributor) 50th Anniversary Video: A Documentary on the History of the American Epilepsy Society is a 20-minute film in which leaders in the society speak about the past and the future of the AES and of epilepsy diagnosis and treatment. Developed by the American Epilepsy Society, 1996.
8. (Moderator) The Role of Potassium Channel Ions in Epilepsy is both a video and a slide presentation available on the Web at Medscape.com. It is designated for 1.5 AMA category 1 credits. The program was produced by the Medical Education Group LLC and funded by an unrestricted grant from Valeant Pharmaceuticals International, 2008.
